The kitchen appliances are hidden behind bespoke wooden cabinets, while the large island is long enough to provide a bar to sit and eat at. Three open shelves display the items used most regularly need for blinds. And although the interior tends to feature more sophisticated lines, the outside aspires to be more in tune with the nature that surrounds it. This starts with the earthy, neutral colours with flashes of red to tie in with the interior, and ends with the simplicity of its finishes, and the large, open spaces in which to enjoy the company of humans, and of course, animals. It is, as the studio itself describes it, 'a space where nature

and the artisan world so typical of the island merge with the luxury of wellbeing.' The combination of natural elements is the secret to a welcoming home that respects the environment.
